Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) and Transportation Enhancement (TE) funds were used to enhance the City's Town Green by creating pedestrian and bicycle connections to and from activity centers within the City of Duluth. These projects provided critical connections to the green, commercial districts, public facilities, and to other downtown amenities. The projects also encouraged more dense, mixed-use development within the City.



Most of the enhancements were placed in the existing rights-of-way and connect to Duluth's Center "town green," shown here, as built by the City of Duluth.

LIVABLE CENTERS INITIATIVE

These projects involved many infrastructure improvements such as sidewalks, crosswalks, ADA compliant ramps and traffic calming devices (e.g., bump-outs). They also incorporated new street furniture, decorative fencing and lighting, landscaping with trees and flower beds, decorative street signage and other streetscape amenities which enhanced both the aesthetics and the safety of the downtown area. BCA was the project manager for the projects from funding, application to construction completion.
