The project was recognized in 2002 by The Georgia Conservancy as being a success story for greenspace conservation.

The greenway will not only provide active and passive recreational opportunities for the citizens of Jesup, but will also help the environment by increasing the urban forest, reducing non-point-source pollution from runoff, improving water quality through stream clean-up, and providing pedestrian and bicycle connections between neighborhoods and schools.

The McMillan Creek Greenway project consisted of the preparation of a concept master plan for the development of an in-town greenway along the city's major surface drainage facility.
